People enjoy making videos. People also dream of becoming famous. Now with video sharing websites (A) YouTube people are combining these two things. By posting your videos on a website, you can become more famous than you ever imagined. And it can happen instantly.

It used to take many years to become an international star. Musicians toured the country and played in small clubs. They almost had to beg people to become interested in their work. Musicians worked really hard. The same was true for actors. $_{7}$ Actors (found, Hollywood, they, where, moved to, work) in low budget movies. They took many small parts in carefully-made movies before anyone noticed them. For ordinary people, it was nearly impossible to appear on TV or in the newspaper. This completely changed with YouTube.

YouTube was created in 2005, and $_{7}$ it quickly became the third most visited website. Anyone can upload a video on YouTube. It has more than 800 million users a month. It is available in 54 languages. Around 60 hours of new videos are added every minute. A video can be rapidly spread on other social media sites (B) Twitter or Facebook. This is called "going viral"." People share a video on the Internet, and then they comment, blog, and tweet about the video until it seems everyone in the world knows $_{7}$ it.

Susan Boyle*2 became a celebrity*3 this way. In 2009, she was an unknown singer from Scotland. She took part in a talent show. Someone put a video of her performance on YouTube. Millions of people watched it. Impressed by her beautiful voice, people shared her video with friends. Soon after her video went viral, she began recording and selling her songs. She quickly became an international singing star.

Videos of people (C) any special talents have also gone viral. In 2007 a father made a short video of a baby and his older brother. He named the video "Charlie bit my finger." It soon became famous all over the world. The two boys now have their own blogs and video websites, and they often appear on TV shows.

Not everyone is happy when their videos go viral. Instant fame*4 can be hard to cope with. Susan Boyle became ill after receiving so much worldwide attention.

Charlie and his brother say they feel embarrassed when people stare at them on the street. People lose all sense of privacy when their videos go viral.

Privacy is not a problem for a dog or cat. These days more people are sharing videos of their pets. If their videos go viral, pet owners can enjoy a moment of fame. But these pet owners do not have to show themselves directly to the public. The dogs and cats don't care one way ($\,$ D $\,$) another. So it is a good situation for everyone.

What is the next trend after singers, babies and cute animals? The answer is probably being uploaded right now. It just needs a little time to go viral.

V 次の英文は、アメリカ人にとっての「プライバシー」に関する文章です。よく読んで下記の問いに答えなさい。

Americans believe that everyone has the right to think and act as an independent person separate from any group. This is one reason why privacy is very important in the United States.

Some expressions that Americans use show how much they value their privacy. When a person says, $_{\mathcal{T}}$ "I (do, in, whatever, can, want, I) the privacy of my own home," she means that in her personal life, she is free to act the way she chooses. When someone says, "People only know what I want them to know about me," he means that $_{\mathcal{T}}$ he decides what to tell others about himself and what to keep private. When people say they need time to themselves, they mean that they want private time, away from others.

Americans protect their privacy in many ways. At home, people put curtains on their windows and fences around their property^{*1} so that no one can look in. Most people don't want their neighbors to observe the way they choose to live. They like to keep their lifestyle private.

In public places, such as buses or stores, people put up "fences" or physical boundaries^{*2}. They usually stay at least six inches away from people they don't know. There are conversational boundaries, too. For example, some people choose to keep their feelings private, but they talk freely about their jobs. Others share their feelings but don't like to discuss their family problems.

 $_{7}$ Americans usually see themselves first as individuals, and then as members of a family, community, or other group. These groups are important because they support their members when they need help. However, because of their sense of privacy, and a $_{\pm}$ desire to do things on their own, many people may be embarrassed to ask for help.

Today, communities around the United States are trying to solve this problem. (A), there are many organizations that assist people with language skills and job training. These organizations try to help without asking a lot of personal information. In some communities police departments teach neighbors how to help each other without being nosy *4 . In these and other ways, people can get the community support they need, and keep the (B) and privacy they value.
